## **PART 1 - CONDUCT OF POSTAL CHAMPIONSHIPS**

### **INTRODUCTION**

1. Purpose. The Dominion of Canada Rifle Association (DCRA) will conduct a Postal Competition consisting of several qualifying matches, in order to determine the appropriate teams and individuals who will be declared National Smallbore or Air Rifle Champions. This Postal Competition is open to members of the Canadian Forces (CF), all Cadet Corps and Squadrons, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, provincial and local police forces, civilian shooting and rod-and-gun clubs and associations, and responsible individuals throughout Canada.
2. Smallbore Matches. The smallbore team and individual matches for the cadet and junior competitions have been removed as the cadets no longer fire smallbore rifle in indoor ranges. Smallbore individual and team competitions are available in the open class.
3. Pairs Matches. In addition to the Open Pairs Smallbore Rifle Match (3.4), a new Cadet Staff/ Cadet Air Rifle Pairs Prone Match (1.6) was introduced in 2011.
4. Air Rifle Matches
  - a. Team Matches. The Air Rifle Team Matches (1.3, 1.7, 1.8, 2.3 and 3.5) are the postal match requirements to be eligible for appropriate team championships.
  - b. Individual Matches. The Individual Air Rifle Matches (1.4, 1.9, 2.4 and 3.6) are the postal match requirements to be eligible for appropriate individual championships.
5. DCRA Membership is required for each competitor entering the DCRA Postal competitions. Postal Program Membership is free, upon application, to Cadets and Juniors. All others must pay the requisite membership fee, as set out in the Program Entry Fees and the Entry Form.
6. Privileges of the special Postal Program Membership are limited to:
  - A. The right to compete in the Postal Competitions, on payment of the requisite Entry Fees.
7. Competitors are encouraged to become full Members and to participate in all DCRA activities. Privileges of annual membership include, in addition to the above, eligibility to:
  - A. Attend and vote at all DCRA General Meetings.
  - B. Hold DCRA office for which otherwise qualified.
  - C. Shoot on DCRA Canadian teams.
  - D. Receive the official DCRA magazine the *Canadian Marksman*.
  - E. Receive DCRA notices, questionnaires and other mailings.
  - F. Shoot in all competitions conducted by the DCRA, on payment of the appropriate entry fee(s).
  - G. Comprehensive liability, accident and worldwide insurance coverage.

## PROCEDURE FOR ENTRY IN MATCHES

8. When the organizations (units, forces, clubs or associations) and individuals receive their DCRA Postal Program, entry forms and membership application forms are included. The organizations and individuals must then complete the entry forms and the membership application forms, and return them to the DCRA prior to the deadline. Upon receipt of the entry and membership application forms, the DCRA will forward the claim sheets and stickers for the targets. The stickers must be affixed to the targets as per the instructions. All claim sheets and the selected targets (see Rule 3) must be completed and returned to the DCRA, for verification by not later than the post-marked date for the appropriate match schedule.
9. Schedule - General for most Matches
  - o **February 5** - Final date for registration. Membership lists should be included when registering. ***The date for registration in Match 1.8, Youth of the Commonwealth, is January 4.***
  - o **April 10** - Final date for return of claim sheets and selected targets to DCRA.
  - o **May** - Team and Individual National Smallbore and Air Rifle Champions to be announced.

## PART 2 - RULES FOR POSTAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

NOTE: All persons taking part in the DCRA Postal Competitions must have access to these Rules and the Match Conditions. It is strongly recommended that a copy of the Rules and the Match Conditions be posted in a prominent place adjacent to the range where the matches are being fired. The rules can also be accessed at [www.dkra.ca](http://www.dkra.ca).

### Rule 1 - Entries

1. Complete the entry form provided; then send it with the appropriate payment to:

2. Entries will not be processed until full payment is received.
3. Postal Program Membership is required for all those taking part in the DCRA Postal Competitions. Cadets and Juniors will receive free Postal Program Memberships on application. DCRA Life and Annual Members are entitled to participate in the Postal Program as part of their membership privileges. All others must pay the Postal Program Membership fee as set out in the Program Entry Fees and the Entry Form. The DCRA reserves the right to refuse entry of any team or individual.

## **Rule 2 - Dates**

1. Targets may be fired any time prior to the closing date specified for each match. Teams and individuals are requested to return the targets as soon as a match or set is completed. This will spread the load for the DCRA marking crew and help to produce early results.

## **Rule 3 - Return of Targets**

1. All completed claim sheets and selected targets must be mailed direct to the DCRA for scoring verification.
2. Only those targets for individual or team scores above the specified minimum for the match conditions need to be returned to the DCRA. Arrange the submitted, selected targets in the order listed on the claim sheets.
3. Claim sheets and the accompanying, selected targets which are postmarked later than the closing date for the match, will not be accepted for scoring. Targets that are sent with insufficient postage will be returned to the sender by the Post Office. This will result in a postage penalty and a possible late entry.

## **Rule 4 - Range Officer**

1. A Range Officer will be appointed by the unit or organization to supervise the conduct of the practice and matches. The Range Officer shall:
  - A. personally measure the range between the forward edge of firing point and the targets to ensure that the distance is no less than that required for the match and type of targets.
  - B. ensure that competitors attach the validation sticker to the back of each target before the target has any holes in it so that two or more shots will strike the validation sticker.
  - C. ensure that competitors sign their targets before firing.
  - D. ensure that targets are scored in accordance with Rule 13.
  - E. on the claim sheets provided, ensure the designated tyro is first followed by other team members in order of their aggregate scores. The complete name and scores of each team member must be entered. Ensure that the printing is legible.
  - F. arrange for the return of all targets as soon as possible after they are completed in accordance with Rule 3.
  - G. ensure that all unused target validation stickers are returned with appropriate claim sheet and targets. Failure to do so may result in the disallowance of some or all of the scores claimed.
  - H. be familiar with all rules and match conditions, and ensure that they are enforced.

## **Rule 5 - Witness**

1. The Range Officer must sign all targets as the witness.

## **Rule 6 - Targets**

1. Validation Stickers. Target validation stickers will be supplied by the DCRA for each match entered. A validation sticker must be glued to the back of each approved target so that two or more shots will perforate the validation sticker.
2. Targets. The individual competitor or team must use only approved targets for each match entered. For the Cadet Air Rifle program, the approved targets are:
  - A. Air Rifle. Ten (10) meter Cadet Air Rifle target, which has ten bulls-eyes for score (one shot each) and two centrally-located, sighting bulls-eyes.
3. Junior and Open. Many civilian clubs already possess equivalent SFC targets for other matches. Hence, for only Junior and Open Matches, the following SFC targets can be substituted for the appropriate DCRA targets.
  - A. Smallbore Rifle. SFC #134 twenty (20) yard Smallbore Rifle (Sporting & UIT Combined), which has ten bulls-eyes for score (one shot each) and two centrally- located, sighting bulls-eyes, and
  - B. Air Rifle. SFC #104 ten (10) meter Air Rifle, which has five bulls-eyes for score (two shots each) and one bottom, sighting bulls-eye.
4. When a unit or association or club enters more than one team in a competition, separate sets of target validation stickers identified by the DCRA will be supplied for each team.
5. Care must be taken not to mix team targets when claiming team scores. Targets incorrectly identified will be disallowed.

## **Rule 7 - Rifles**

1. Smallbore Rifle. All commercially available smallbore rifles of conventional design conforming to the following restrictions:
  - A. The caliber of the rifle will be .22 in. Long Rifle Rimfire (commercial designation).
  - B. The butt plate may be adjustable upward or downward, up to three centimeters from a neutral position.
  - C. Trigger pull is unrestricted but set triggers are not allowed.
  - D. A thumb rest, palm rest, heel rest and hook butt plate are prohibited.
2. Air Rifle. Any type of compressed air or CO<sub>2</sub> rifle, commercially available and of conventional appearance, which conforms to the specifications set out in Rule 7.1 for the Smallbore Rifle, except that the caliber is 4.5 mm (.177 Caliber).
3. Cadets. The only rifles permitted in Section One of the DCRA Postal Program, are the Daisy/Avanti 853C Air Rifles.

4. Rifles in Matches. The competitor must use the same rifle throughout all stages of the match. However, in the single case of a malfunction or disabled rifle, the competitor may change rifles with the permission of the Range Officer. An additional 5 minutes will be added to the relay time if a rifle is replaced. Extra sighters will be provided.

### **Rule 8 - Sights**

1. Smallbore and Air Rifle. Only iron sights may be used, except in Match 3.3. The foresight may be a tube which will accept a ring or a post element.
2. Daisy/Avanti 853C. Only those iron sights as issued with the 853C may be used.
3. Match 3.3. Any sight, including an optical sight, may be used with the small bore rifle in this match.

### **Rule 9 - Slings**

1. The use of either one or two point slings is optional in the prone position for Smallbore Rifle and for the Junior Air Rifle Matches. Only the sling issued with the Daisy/Avanti 853C rifle may be used in any Cadet Match. The use of the sling is not permitted in any standing rifle match. Maximum sling width is 40 mm. No part of the rifle may touch the sling or any of its attachments except at the sling swivel and the hand stop.

### **Rule 10 - Ammunition**

1. Smallbore .22 Caliber Rimfire. Only bullets made of lead or similar soft material may be used. Hollow point, tracer, incendiary or explosive bullets are specifically excluded from ammunition authorized for match use.
2. Air Rifle. Only pellets of Caliber 4.5 mm (.177) of any type or form may be used. Steel projectiles are not allowed. The re-use of fired pellets is not recommended.

### **Rule 11 - Fired Rounds**

1. Scoring Rounds. Unless otherwise directed in the match conditions, the ten shots for score must be fired in such a manner as to use all the aiming marks equally.
2. Sighting Rounds. Unlimited sighting rounds are allowed. Most DCRA approved targets do not have any sighting diagrams; however, an auxiliary sighting target may be used alongside the match target. The air rifle targets (Rule 6) have sighting diagrams and these may be used for sighting shots. In Cadet matches, only the zeroing diagrams included on the target are to be used. If the first sighting shot strikes the scoring area, i.e. anywhere on the DCRA target or outside the sighting rectangle of the air rifle target, the shooter will not be penalized if he/she immediately draws the occurrence to the attention of the Range Officer who must immediately spot the shot and at the end of the relay, mark the shot as "first sighter" and sign the target. Should the shooter fail to notify the range officer before he/she fires a second shot, all shots on the scoring area will count as scoring shots. Any subsequent sighting shots which strike on the scoring area will be counted as scoring shots.

## **Rule 12 - Positions and Aids to Shooting**

1. Prone. The body must be extended on the shooting station with the head toward the target. The rifle must be supported by both hands and one shoulder only. The cheek may be placed against the rifle stock in the sighting position. The rifle may not touch or rest against any other point or object. The forward supporting forearm and hand must be clearly and visibly raised from the surface of the shooting station forward of the elbow. The back of the forward wrist bone (carpus) shall be at least 100mm (approximately 4 inches) clear of the shooting station.
2. Standing. The shooter shall stand free with both feet on the ground or a thin mat without any other support. The rifle shall be held with both hands and the shoulder, the cheek and the part of the chest next to the shoulder. The left upper arm and elbow may be supported on the chest or on the hip. The use of the sling is prohibited for all rifles in this position. (Left-handed shooters reverse these directions).
3. Distance. In all positions, the foremost part of the body touching the ground must be behind the line marking the distance at which the rifle is being fired.
4. Jackets and Padding. Shoulder pads, and elbow pads, or a coat or jacket embodying these features, may be worn providing they are constructed so as not to provide artificial support. No adhesive or sticky substance shall be applied to jackets, pads, gloves, slings or mats. A button, hook or strap may be placed on the sleeve of the shooting coat to support the sling loop that is placed on the upper arm.
5. Gloves. Gloves which do not form any artificial support may be worn.
6. Shooting Mats. Groundsheets or shooting mats of maximum thicknesses 50 mm uncompressed and 10 mm compressed may be used, provided they are not constructed or used in a manner to provide artificial rest or support.
7. Safety Glasses and Hearing Protection. The use of safety glasses and hearing protection is mandatory in all rifle matches for all competitors and range staff.
8. All devices or equipment which may facilitate shooting and which are not mentioned in these rules, or which are contrary to the spirit of these rules and regulations, are forbidden. Range Officers shall have the right to examine the shooter's apparel. It shall be the competitor's responsibility to submit questionable equipment and apparel for official inspection and approval in sufficient time prior to the beginning of a match so that it will not inconvenience either the competitor or the official.

### **Rule 13 - Scoring**

1. Targets will be scored, and the score claimed by individual teams will be entered on the appropriate claim sheets and forwarded to the DCRA as directed in Rule 3. **TARGETS SHALL BE SCORED BY INSPECTION ONLY. THE INSERTION OF PLUG GAUGES OR ANY OTHER OBJECTS INTO SHOT HOLES IS NOT PERMITTED OTHER THAN BY THE DCRA. THE SCORES FOR ANY SHOT HOLES SHOWING EVIDENCE OF SUCH INSERTIONS SHALL BE DISALLOWED.** Competitors must score their own targets and complete claim sheets to claim a score. The DCRA will review the targets and scores claimed for all winners and near winners and will spot check other scores claimed at random.
2. A shot hole touching the outside diameter of a scoring ring will be scored with the value of that ring.
3. No allowance can be made for a shot once the bullet/pellet has left the rifle and hits the target.
4. Targets are to be numbered by the competing corps/club with scores entered in order of the number on the target, lowest number first, on the proper claim sheet. The targets are to be arranged in the same order as on the claim sheet.
5. Team Captains and individual competitors are responsible to ensure that their targets are correctly scored and that their claim sheets have been properly completed. The DCRA accepts no responsibility for the correctness of any claim sheet and may disallow any scores claimed if an error is detected. The decision of the DCRA Postal Program Committee will be final on all matters concerning scores, placement of teams and individuals, and prizes awarded.

### **Rule 14 - Penalties**

1. The following penalties are to be enforced by the Range Officer:
  - A. If a shooter alters a firearm or equipment which has already been checked, before or during the competition, he/she shall be disqualified.
  - B. If a competitor fires more than the prescribed number of shots in a match, the shot(s) of the highest value will be deducted to reduce the total number of shots to the prescribed number. See Rule 11.2.
  - C. If a competitor fires more than the prescribed number of shots on a scoring diagram, he/she must fire a like number of fewer shots on a subsequent scoring diagram in the same match. He/she will not be penalized for the first two such occurrences in a single match, but he/she will be penalized two points for the third and each succeeding occurrence in that match.
  - D. If a competitor fires more than the prescribed number of shots in a match, the shot(s) of the highest value will be deducted to reduce the total number of shots to the prescribed number. In addition, a two-point penalty will be deducted for each excess shot.

- E. If a shooter fires a sighting shot onto the scoring diagram of another shooter, he/she shall be penalized by deduction of two points from his/her own record score. A shooter who fires a sighting shot onto the sighting diagram of another competitor shall not be penalized.
2. The following regulations shall be enforced if a shooter fires a competition shot onto the competition or sighting target of another shooter (The Range Officer must attest to each such occurrence):
    - A. When it can be clearly established that a competitor has cross fired onto another competitor's target, the shooter at fault shall lose the maximum possible value of each shot. b. If it cannot be established clearly and quickly which shot belongs to the competitor whose target has been cross-fired upon, he/she shall be credited with the highest value(s) from each diagram.
    - B. As soon as a crossfire is suspected, a competitor or cadet coach must immediately notify the range staff.
  3. Shots fired after the expiration of the time limit will not be counted.
  4. An unsigned or unwitnessed target may be disallowed.
  5. Targets postmarked later than called for in the match conditions may not be accepted and no score will be awarded.
  6. Failure to return all validation stickers, whether used or not, may result in the team score being disallowed.
  7. Failure to comply with the conditions set for any match, or conduct which is contrary to the spirit of these competitions will result in the score being disallowed. If a competitor enters any individual match or team match more than once, his second and subsequent scores will be disallowed.
  8. Once firing has commenced on a target, it must be completed without interruption. The only allowable exception is for a disabled rifle, verified by the Range Officer. Any other interruptions may cause the target to be disallowed, at the discretion of the Range Officer.

### **Rule 15 - Coaching**

1. Cadet Competitions. A “Cadet Coach” is defined as another cadet team member. Coaching is permitted and encouraged for all cadet matches. With the Air Rifle, an assistant is permitted to assist in cocking the rifle when the 'firer' is in the prone position. The coach or assistant may not touch or support the rifle or the firer while the latter is aiming and firing. Verbal communication is not permitted while the firer is aiming and firing. An “Adult Coach” is defined as any member of the Canadian Forces or a Civilian Instructor. Either an Adult Coach or Cadet Coach may be used in any cadet match.
2. Non-Cadet Competitions. Coaching is permitted and encouraged for all team matches. Coaching is not permitted during individual matches.

### **Rule 16 - Shooting Categories**

1. Junior. For the purpose of these matches, a junior is defined as a person who is over 12 years of age and less than 19 years of age on the day his/her last target in any match, is fired.
2. A Cadet Tyro is any cadet who has not reached his/her 15th birthday on or before 15 May of the competition year.

### **Rule 17 - Classification**

1. Smallbore Rifle (.22 LR)

Master 97.0 or over, Expert 91.0 to 96.9, Sharpshooter 80.0 to 90.9, Marksman below 80.0

2. Air Rifle (.177 inch or 4.5 mm)

**Standing** Master 85 or over, Expert 75 to 84.99, Sharpshooter 65 to 74.99, Marksman below 65.0

**Prone** Master 97.0 or over, Expert 91.0 to 96.9, Sharpshooter 80.0 to 90.9, Marksman below 80.0

Note: An individual who achieves the Smallbore Master classification may apply in writing to the DCRA and declare himself/herself a 'Smallbore Life Master'. He/she will receive a distinctive lapel pin and retain this classification for life.

### **Rule 18 - Ranges**

Ranges may be indoor or outdoor and may be 10 meters, 50 feet, 60 feet, 75 feet or 25 meters as measured from the front of the firing point to the targets, as appropriate for the particular match.

## **Rule 19 - Ties**

1. Tie. A tie occurs when two or more competitors or teams in any one match have the same numerical total score. For the purpose of ranking targets to resolve the tie, the validation stickers for postal matches have been printed in numerical sequence. The lowest numbered sticker will be deemed to have been shot first and the highest numbered sticker will be deemed to have been shot last, for purposes of tie-breaking.

### Matches

A. Individual - all ties through 10th place will be broken in the following order:

- (i) By the highest score of the last relay working in descending order by each target.
- (ii) By the highest number of 10's, 9's, 8's, 7's, etc.
- (iii) By the highest number of inner 10's, where an inner 10 on a target which does not have an inner 10-ring or x-ring shall be a 10 which does not touch the 9-ring.

B. Teams

- (i) Ties in team events for 1st place through 5th place will be broken by totaling the result of all team members and following the procedure specified in paragraph 2a above.
- (ii) Ties for 6th place and below will be listed in equal rank with the appropriate number of spaces left vacant below the tied position before the next score is numbered.

## **Rule 20 – Time Limits**

Unless otherwise stated in match conditions the following time limits shall apply:

1. Rifle, deliberate fire
  - A. Prone – 1 minute per scoring shot (i.e. 10 minutes for 10 rounds)
  - B. Standing – 1½ minutes per scoring shot (i.e. 15 minutes for 10 rounds).
2. Unlimited sighting shots may be fired, but no extra time will be added to the time limit prescribed for the number of shots fired.
3. Handicapped shooters may be given suitable additional time, at the discretion of the range officer.

## **Rule 21 – Awards**

1. The DCRA reserves the right to adjust the prize lists of any match if enrollment drops below a reasonable level of registration.
2. All matches are subject to the following minimum thresholds:
  - Individual Matches: Gold awarded at 5 entries, Silver at 8 and Bronze at 11+
  - Team Matches: Gold awarded at 5 entries, Silver at 10 and Bronze at 15+.

## **SECTION ONE: CADET INDIVIDUAL AND TEAM SMALL-BORE AND AIR RIFLE POSTAL CHAMPIONSHIPS**

The DCRA conducts this program to provide a source of enjoyment as well as an opportunity for skill enhancement and self-discipline. The DCRA will base all its results on one set of competitions. Targets fired in respective DCRA matches will be the means by which the DCRA declares its National Individual and Team Champions in Air Rifle.

The Competitions in this section are restricted to Cadets. Corps may enter a separate team in the Air Rifle. An individual cadet is permitted to fire on only one air rifle team.

A Cadet Tyro is any cadet who has not reached his/her 15th birthday on or before 15 May of the competition year. Adult Coaches are encouraged to train more than one tyro and have the tyro(s) who are not selected for the unit team shoot in Match 1.4.

A Cadet Staff Member is any CIC Officer, CI or Volunteer with the Corps who has been security cleared to work with the Cadets by their respective Cadet League.

## MATCH 1.3 CADET AIR RIFLE PRONE TEAM MATCH

Open to any number of teams from a Sea, Army or Air Cadet Corps/Squadron recognized by the DCRA. No individual competitor may shoot for more than one air rifle team .

<u>Team Strength:</u>	Up to 5 members, highest 4 including Tyro to count.
<u>Position:</u>	Prone
<u>Rifle:</u>	Daisy/Avanti model 853C shall be used in these matches. Single shot loading must be used.
<u>Sights:</u>	Iron sights as issued
<u>Classification:</u>	DCRA classifications do not apply.
<u>Course of Fire:</u>	40 rounds deliberate per team member, 10 rounds per target. Unlimited sighters. HPS: individual 400; team 1600.
<u>Time Limit:</u>	15 minutes for 10 shot string and any number of sighters.
<u>Distance:</u>	10 metres.
<u>Targets:</u>	Four targets per team member, as per Rule 6.
<u>Spotting Scopes:</u>	Spotting telescopes may be used by both the shooter and/or the coach.
<u>Aids to Shooting:</u>	Shooting gloves, cotton twill shooting jackets and one or two point slings are permitted.
<u>Safety Equipment:</u>	Safety glasses are mandatory during live firing for all competitors and range staff.
<u>Ammunition:</u>	As issued by DND
<u>Team Instructor:</u>	An adult must be appointed for the team and will be referred to as the “Adult Coach”.
<u>Coaching:</u>	See Rule 15.

- Closing Date: By END February, the DCRA will declare the three Canadian Cadet Teams from the First Stage for each class. The DCRA will send NSRA targets, validation stickers and claim sheets to these Cadet Units, who must fire their targets by March 29.
- Return of Targets: All targets and claim sheets are to be returned to the DCRA. See Rule 3.
- Distance: Ranges may be indoor or outdoor. Air rifle competitions are fired at 10 meters.
- Course of Fire: 20 rounds deliberate (five rounds per NSRA target, with one round at each of five target rings).
- Targets: Four NSRA 10 meter Air Rifle Targets per team member.
- Safety Equipment: Safety glasses are mandatory during live firing for all competitors and range staff.
- Results: The DCRA will score targets from Canadian entries and forward results plus targets of the three teams to CCRS. The overall Commonwealth results will be published in August, 2016 by the CCRS.
- Remaining conditions and rules for the Second Stage are the same as for the First Stage.

## SUBSTITUTE TARGETS FOR POSTAL PROGRAM

Rule Six specifies the smallbore and air rifle targets normally used in the DCRA Postal Program. However, the following substitute targets are authorized for use:

- a. Cadets. There are smallbore and air rifle targets for Cadet Corps which have been authorized by the Directorate of Cadets. However, the NSRA of GB targets will still be used for the Second Stage of Matches 1.8, and will be supplied by the DCRA.

Smallbore. Sixty (60) foot Cadet Smallbore Rifle target, which has ten outer bulls-eyes for score (one shot each) and two centrally-located, sighting bulls-eyes, and

Air Rifle. Ten (10) meter Cadet Air Rifle target, which has ten outer bulls-eyes for score (one shot each) and two sighting bulls-eyes.

- b. Junior and Open. Many civilian clubs already possess equivalent Shooting Federation of Canada (SFC) targets for other matches. Hence, for only Junior and Open Matches, the following SFC targets can be substituted for the appropriate DCRA targets.

Smallbore. SFC #134 twenty (20) yard Smallbore Rifle (Sporting & UIT Combined), which has ten bulls-eyes for score (one shot each) and two centrally-located, sighting bulls-eyes, and

Air Rifle. SFC #104 ten (10) meter Air Rifle, which has five bulls-eyes for score (two shots each) and one bottom, sighting bulls-eye.
